

Mid Year Report 2007

Firstly I would like to wish everybody a Happy New Year! My apologies for the lack of contact for at least the last six months, but a long period of illness did not help matters. I recently returned from Thailand and Burma, where I saw incredible mateship displayed not only amongst the ANZAC pilgrimage group but also to a Japanese researcher who joined us for a day. It restored my faith in that the old Aussie tradition of "giving a bloke a fair go" has not completely died, contrary to media coverage.

Since my last report there have been outstanding developments within the region. The Bandiana, Seymour/Puckapunyal and RAEME Vietnam Veterans - Southern groups have all been presented with their "Charters" as separate Chapters of the RAEME Association of Victoria (RAV). The RAEME Association of Tasmania (RAT) continues to grow after their outstanding inaugural "Mixed Dinner" held at the Claremont RSL in Jun 06. The RAT Committee has followed up with successful Corps Birthday celebrations and ANZAC Day activities this year. It is hoped that both LTCOL Mick Buldo and I will be able to attend this year's RAT Formal Dinner to be held on 7 Jul 07, to make up for our inability to attend their Corps Birthday activities last year. The RAV held its last Colonel Commandant's Corps Birthday Dinner on 1 Dec 06. The night was a great success with 81 attending along with BRIG David McGahey and his lovely wife Sue, as Guest of Honour - in recognition of David's tremendous contribution to the Corps over the last four years as Head of Corps (HOC). BRIG David Welch and LTCOL Nick Stanton, as the new Head of Corps and Deputy respectively, have big shoes to fill with both BRIG McGahey and LTCOL Andy Adams' departure.

LTCOL Craig Atkins and former MAJ Colin Galvin are to be highly commended for bring along their entire families to participate in this unique commemoration service for the Corps.

Their commitment and the dedication of 84 year old Doug Brazier, who drove himself to the Shrine on this hot day, demonstrated the true spirit of the Corps, which those not attending without just reason, have obviously lost or never had. It was particularly disappointing to see the lack of so-called friends of CAPT Paul Lawton who failed to support his fiancée, Catriona Campbell whilst she laid his cross in the grounds of the Shrine under the RAEME Tree of Remembrance. At least her Father flew down from Canberra and her Grandfather was present to help her new RAEME "Mates" to support her both at the service and at the Emerald Hotel afterwards. How times and personal values have changed in this dollar driven world. Again reflected by the lack of RAEME Vietnam Vets and Peacekeepers that attended the Commemoration.

Feedback indicated that the Dinner was highly successful with a greater attendance than last year, with personnel attending from Graytown and the DHOC LTCOL Stanton coming from as far as Bandiana. The Prince Philip Banner was professionally paraded by LT Dean Kachab, WO2 Marty Fisher and SGT Darren Werry. Regrettably, my now annual ANZAC duties in Burma again prevented my attendance at both the RAV's ANZAC Reunion and the Mafia Dinner.

Anyway, well done Jeff and all concerned with the 2007 Mafia Dinner and my appreciation to you and LTCOL Mick Buldo for all your support throughout the year.

However despite developments on most fronts, sadly it appears that the RAEME Vietnam Veterans-Southern Chapter is still plagued with bickering over the disestablishment of the previously "defunct" National RAEME Vietnam Vets Association and distribution of funds, which will undoubtedly end up destroying the autonomy of this group - if a resolution is not found quickly between warring factions. The end of the year will also sadly see the disappearance of the last ARA RAEME Workshop in the Region when 26 Tpt Sqn Wksp re-locates to Brisbane.

This does not mean that ARES units with ARA staff will have an easy time to win the Regional ARA Craftsman of the Year Award, as your nominations must still meet the high standard required for this prestigious award. Ongoing promotion last year resulted in four nominations in 2006, two ARA and two ARES, the highest result in decades. An outstanding achievement and all units concerned are to be highly commended for their effort, especially as the standard of the reports were exceptional, thereby resulting in the Region winning the National Award for ARES Craftsman of the Year.

It was particularly pleasing to see this important Award go to the Apple Isle after years of apparent neglect and inactivity.

SUBJECT:
DOUGLAS GRAHAM BORLACE
KIA SOUTH VIETNAM 15/7/1968

Craftsman Douglas Graham Borlace was KIA in South Vietnam on the afternoon of the 15th July, 1968 whilst on operations in an Armoured Personnel Carrier (APC) with A Sqn. 3rd Calvary Regiment Light Aid Detachment (A Sqn. 3 Cav.Regt. LAD),

Doug was posted to A Sqn on 29th June, 1968 as a vehicle mechanic (VM) in the Corps of the Royal Australian Electrical & Mechanical Engineers (RAEME). With Doug in the APC was Timothy (Tim) Foster and John Chislett, members of 1st Royal Australian Regiment – (1 RAR), Brian Smith Platoon Sergeant of 1 RAR – APC Driver and Kenneth Turnham.

The APC in the morning had attracted small arms fire from the Viet Cong (VC) they were then lured into an ambush site by the VC, the APC hitting a land mine wounding Tim Foster and the crew Commander Kenneth Turnham.

Doug Borelace was killed immediately, the crew commander instructed the soldiers to drag Doug's body back into the APC he had been travelling on the outside of the APC. His boots and legs were visible through the crew commander's turret, when they dragged Doug back into the APC he had been decapitated from the waist up.

For many years after, Tim Foster lived with this memory of that day in South Vietnam (15th July, 1968), Tim and all members of 1 RAR and the APC Crew had only met Doug on the morning of the 15th when he came across to assist repair/replacement of a track on the APC. It is believed a pin had come out of the carrier track.

Some year later with the assistance of the Battalion Padre, Brian Tinker and other parties, they were able to find out Doug had been adopted at an early age. After locating Doug's adopted parents, Tim Foster and the Padre visited them to explain the loss and sadness of losing Doug in action.

His adopted parents were not interested in Doug's death nor his time in Vietnam or Army Service.

Years later again Tim eventually located Doug's birth parents, visited them, and was met with the same indifference.

At Enoggera Army Barracks in Brisbane, a Borelace Club has been dedicated to Doug. The RAEME Vietnam Association carried a flag with plaque in memory of Doug at the unveiling of the Vietnam War Memorial in Canberra in October 1992 (we will now endeavour to locate this flag and present it to the Borelace Club in Enoggera).

Veterans Affairs have a memorial plaque dedicated to Doug in Sterling Cemetery in Adelaide. In Kyabram, Victoria, there is an avenue of honour for fallen members of the Royal Australian Armoured Corp who died in South Vietnam. A tree and plaque has been dedicated to Doug Borelace by the Armoured Corp.

It is my belief that Doug is entitled to four medals from his Vietnam campaign, plus a Returned from Active Service Badge (RAS Badge).

If the families of Doug's - both birth and adopted – have not applied for his medals and our investigations would suggest they have not, is it possible for the RAEME Vietnam Veterans Association of Victoria (Southern Chapter) Committee be able to apply for Doug's medals and RAS badge have them officially presented to Borelace Club in Enoggera Army Barracks?

I also believe Doug is entitled to a "Certificate of Service" for his time in Vietnam.

All parties would more than appreciate any assistance or advice in this matter.


