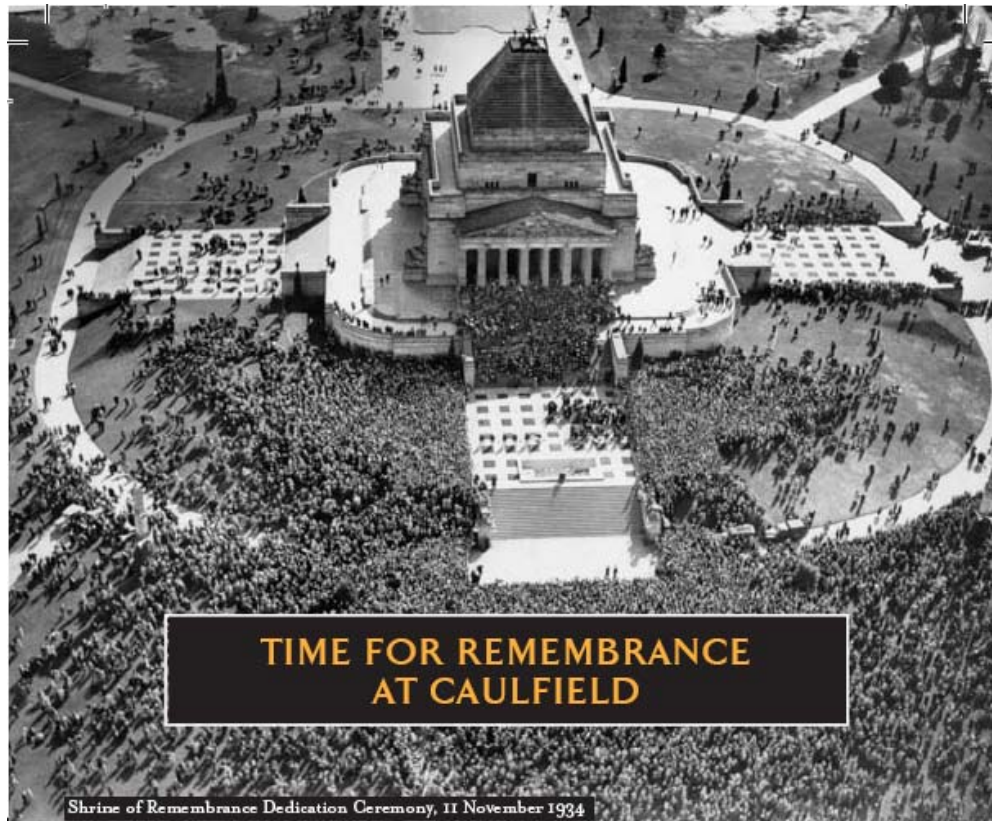

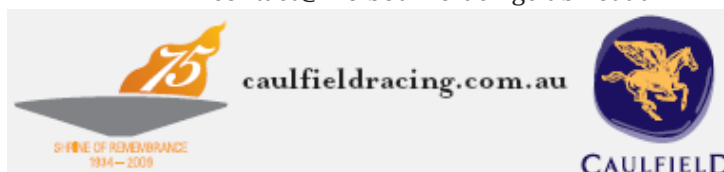
J.J. LISTON STAKES DAY SATURDAY 15th AUGUST

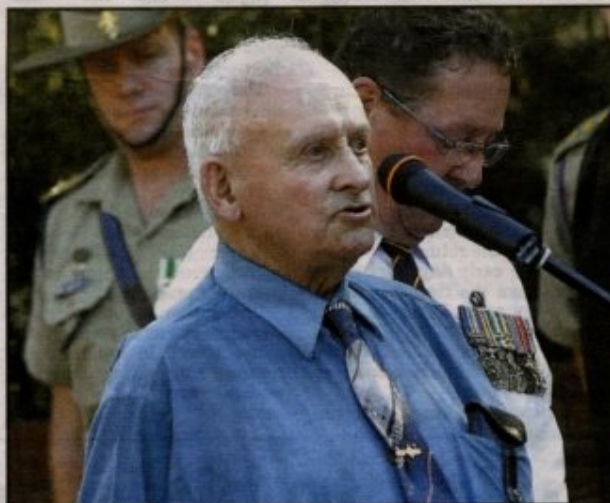

FORMER army tradesmen gathered at their "spiritual home" at Bandiana South last night to honour their fallen comrades.

The memorial service was timed to mark the founding of the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers corps in 1942.

Its successor, the Army School of Electrical Mechanical Engineering, continues at Latchford Barracks and its commanding officer and chief instructor, Lieutenant-Colonel Todd Ashurst, was a guest speaker at the service.

"We're here to pause and re-

member and reflect on those who have come before," he told the crowd assembled at the RAEME Craftsman Memorial.

"I'd like you all to think of this memorial as the spiritual home of the corps."

Among those gathered was Wodonga man Alan French, 90, who joined the corps in 1942.


Mr French was introduced by Colonel Commandant for Victoria-Tasmania Colonel Brian Jones, of Albury, before reading the ode to the fallen.

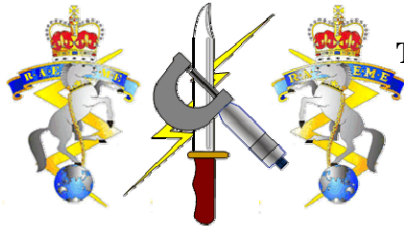

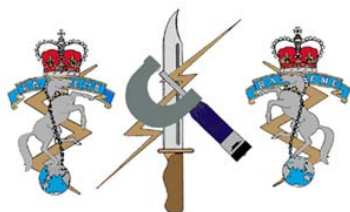
