He was posted to Puckapunyal Log Bn in 1996, 1 CSSB in 2002 and 9 FSB in 2005. In 2007, CFN Griffin separated from the ARA and was posted to 4 CSSB where he still actively works.

Craftsman Griffin is a young member of the EIR section within 105 Workshop Coy. He is a keen member who parades at the unit and participates in various activities regularly including supporting the civilian community during the Victorian bush fires. CFN Griffin is dependable, works hard and achieves well above his expected ability as a tradesman.

Craftsman Griffin had assumed the role of the section supervisor/Corporal role at his own accord in the absence of the ARA EIR Cpl. CFN Griffin had sought the status of the equipment in the section for repair and arranged completion of the remaining tasks. Plaque Dedication at Saint Paul’s Cathedral 2-10-10

Fred Greenway, Dennis Clarke, Dusty Miller, Gary Vapp and a number of other Vets attended the dedication of a Viet Nam War plaque by the Geelong Viet Nam Veterans Association. RAEME Vet Andy Treffry was a member of the committee who did an excellent job in organizing the Event. Well done Andy.

Plaque Dedication at the Viet Nam Vets Museum 28-11-10

A large number of Australian and Vietnamese Veterans attended the Plaque Dedication by the Vietnamese Veterans at the Phillip Island Museum. Good to see the support staff of Jim Coghlan and Gary Elliot working hard to make for a successful day. It was interesting to see that most of the Vietnamese Veterans could fit into their original uniforms, unlike many of us. John and Krishna Methven and their team have worked hard to get the second stage of the

museum hangar completed. It houses a yet to be restored Canberra bomber and Sikorsky Sea King helicopter.

Ross Smith sent us an article relating to the current status of deterring mines, IEDs, or roadside bombs, which caused nearly 60 percent of U.S. deaths in Iraq. Developing mine clearing vehicles such as the “Buffalo” using a V shaped hull, similar to the “Auslab”, with an elevated body and of heavy grade steel which encases electric lines, suspension and fuel tanks. A Mack 400 Hp turbo diesel engine is mated to a five speed automatic transmission, with a modified transfer case to drive the six wheels. The tyres are 15,000 pound rated Michelin XZLs, along with inserts that provide run flat ability for over fifty miles. It utilizes a 30 feet hydraulic interrogating arm with a “spork” attachment, which, is operated by camera and remote control from inside the vehicle. It supersedes the use of robots, weighs 45,320 pounds and has a top speed of 55 mph.
