A most successful week consisting of a Monday evening meet and greet with some forty odd people in attendance. ANZAC Day was a bus trip to the dawn service at the Shrine followed by breakfast.

### Vietnam: LOOKING BACK AT THE AMERICAN FACTS

- \* Prior to 1965; US Advisors and AID only.
- \* 1965 - 1967; Buildup of US Forces and logistical supply bases, plus heavy Fighting to counter Communist North Vietnamese Invasion.
- \* 1968 – 1970; Communist “insurgency” destroyed to the point where 90% of the towns and villages in South Vietnam were free from Communist Domination. As an example: By 1971 throughout the entire populous Mekong Delta, the monthly rate of Communist insurgency dropped to an average of 3 incidents per 100,000 of population. In 1969 Nixon started troop withdrawals that were essentially complete by 1971.
- \* Dec. 1972; Paris Peace Agreement negotiated and agreed by North Vietnam, South Vietnam, the southern Vietnamese Communists [VC, NLF/ PRG] and the United States.
- \* Jan 1973; All four parties formally sign Paris Peace Agreements.
- \* Mar 1973; Last US POW released from Hanoi Hilton and in accordance with Paris Agreements, last American GI leaves Vietnam.
- \* Aug 1973; US Congress passes the Case – Church law which forbids, US Naval forces from sailing on the seas surrounding, US ground forces from Operating on the land of and US forces flying in the air over South Vietnam, North Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos. This at a time when America had drawn its Cold War battle lines and as a result had the US Navy protecting Taiwan, 50,000 troops in South Korea and over 300,000 Troops in Western Europe[ which has a land area, economy and population comparable to that of the United States], along with ironclad guarantees that if Communist forces should cross any of those Cold War Lines or Soviet Armour should role across the DMZ in Korea or the Iron Curtain in Europe, then there would be an unlimited response by the Armed forces of the United States, to include the use of nuclear weapons. In addition these defense commitments required the annual expenditure of hundreds of billions of US dollars.

Conversely, in 1975 when Soviet Armour rolled across the international borders of South Vietnam, the US response was nothing. In addition Congress cut all AID to South Vietnamese and would not provide them with a single bullet.

\* In spite of the Case – Church Congressional guarantee, the North Vietnamese were very leery of US President Nixon. They viewed him as one unpredictable, incredibly tough nut. He had, in 1972, for the first time in the war, mined Hai Phong Harbour and sent the B-52 bombers against the North to force them into signing the Paris Peace Agreements. Previously the B-52s had been used only against Communist troop concentrations in remote regions of South Vietnam and occasionally against carefully selected sanctuaries in Cambodia, plus against both Sanctuaries and supply lines in Laos.

\* Aug 1974; Nixon resigns.

## MEMORIES

*13th Intake Army Apprentice Blacksmith*

Is it just me, or the age that I am at, but sometimes I see something, or hear something and somewhere in the back of my brain there is a little "click" and the mists of time roll back and there I am, back in my twenties, not long out of the Army Apprentices School, full of wonder and off to see the world (at the taxpayers' expense, of course!)

Reading through the July issue of the "Lightning Flash" and spied an article by the Colonel-Commandant, and up popped a name from 1964 - Larry Foley.

Early in that year I had decided that I had been at 3 Base and 105 Medium Workshops long enough, and applied for a posting to Northern Command. In those days, the Command was fairly small and was sometimes referred to as the "Queensland Army" and inward postings were fairly hard to get.

However, my luck was in. 1 General Troops Workshop at Bulimba needed a blacksmith so in November I headed north with my wife and baby son to our new home. I marched in to Bulimba and met my new boss, Lt. Larry Foley and soon settled in as part of G.E. Platoon. The unit was a pretty mobile outfit, part of the Field Force and most of our equipment was mounted on good old 6x6 Studebakers (flat out at 42mph in overdrive!) We spent a lot of time out bush, usually up around Tin Can Bay.

The boss was always thing of things and gadgets, and came up with the idea of a light weight, portable mounting for the 50-calibre Browning machine gun. He designed it, and the fitters, the coach trimmer and the welder (me) made it.

Working back on the project one night, I was welding away with the help of a couple of the guys, and using a low home-made floodlight for illumination. I finished my weld and straightened up and found the boss right beside me, observing. He was fairly tall, and he stood up right under the flood-light, shattering the bulb with a loud BANG! Fortunately, he was wearing his cap, but the result was quite spectacular! Of course, we "Crafties" dissolved into helpless laughter. He muttered something to the effect that "It wasn't that bloody funny!" to which one of us quipped "No sir! But you're not standing where we are!"

Anyway, the manufacture of the mount was completed and we piled into a couple of Land Rovers and went off to Tin Can Bay to try it out. On the Tank Range there were the vast open spaces of 1000 yards or more, with lots of old cars and truck bodies that made good targets. A series of firings took place, and each of us had a turn. I must say I was pretty impressed with the way you "walk" the gun up to a distant target with a couple of sighting bursts then just about destroy a vehicle with a sustained burst.

Movie footage was recorded and plenty of still photos taken, but I never did find out if anything came of the boss's invention as I left shortly afterwards for Vietnam.

But there you are. As I said at the start, sometimes you just hear, see or read something and the old brain goes into overdrive, and the memories come flooding back. There must be a lot of you out there with better stories than mine. Jot them down, send them in, and share them with the rest of us.

My regards to the boss, and any of the old team who happen to read this!
