

RAEME COLONELS COMMANDANT

Corps of the Australian Army are entitled to have appointed Colonels Commandant and Representative Colonels Commandant to assist in an honorary capacity in the domestic matters of that Corps. The title of Colonel Commandant is generally adopted by a Corps in accordance with tradition. When a Corps has more than one Colonel Commandant, one of them will be appointed Representative Colonel Commandant to assist the head of Corps in the co-ordination of the Colonel Commandants of their Corps.

RAEME is authorised to appoint six Colonels Commandant. These include the Colonel Commandant 1MD, 2MD, 3MD, 4MD, 5MD, and 6MD. The Representative Colonel Commandant is appointed from one of these. A Colonel Commandant is appointed for a four-year-term, and Representative Colonel Commandant for a two-year-term. Both these terms may be extended.

Functions

The functions of the Honorary Colonel Commandant broadly concerns giving advice and assistance, as sought by Commanding Officers or Superior Commanders and Staff, or the DGEME, on matters such as:

- a. fostering Esprit-de-Corps in RAEME,
- b. general welfare of the Corps,
- c. maintenance of interest in the Corps by the Civil Community, and
- d. memorials and customs.

They contribute directly to Corps morale by visiting RAEME units in their Military Districts.

The function of the Representative Colonel Commandant is to offer advice on such matters as are referred to him by the DGEME. These include:

- a. controlling or advising on the administration of the Corps Fund.

- b. liaison between the Corps and

He also acts on behalf of the DGEME on such matters as the purchase of Corps initial and reciprocal presentations, and he chairs the RAEME Corps Committee Conferences.



Do You Remember? . . .

Let's take a wander down memory lane for a moment.



On your right is illustrated a few that just come to hand that could possible jog your memory. If you can recall any similar designs, it would be much appreciated for the compilation as part of our Corps history.





BADGE AWARDED



Experienced Instructors at 1RTB now wear a badge of office following introduction of the Recruit Instructor's Badge (RIB).

The badge was introduced to provide recognition for soldiers who have proven they possess the knowledge, skills and attitudes required to instruct ARA and ARes Recruits.

Based on the Qualified Instructor's Badge, the new badge has the letters "RI" replacing "QI", with the 1RTB incorporated in a scroll.

The RIB is worn by Corporals and Sergeants who have completed a 12 months posting at 1RTB, satisfactorily completed an RISC and 6 months effective service as a 1RTB Instructor, been recommended by their OC and approved by the CI 1RTB for the award.

Historically, the RIB dates back to pre-WW2 when the Australian Army established an Instructional Corps, whose members wore a cloth badge on their right sleeve that proclaimed the wearers as Army Instructors.



RAEME RECOGNITION OF SERVICE CERTIFICATE

(by Maj G. POLKINGHORNE)

In 1980 the RAEME Corps Committee approved the introduction of the RAEME Recognition of Service Certificate (shown opposite). The Certificate is designed to recognise 20 years or more loyal and dedicated service to the Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. Both military and civilian personnel are eligible to receive the Certificate.

Award Criteria

Military

ARA - The recipient must be a RAEME officer or soldier who has completed 20 years or more service and who has elected discharge.

ARes - The recipient must be an officer or soldier who has completed a total of 20 years or more efficient service in RAEME and who has elected discharge. Discontinuous service is not to exceed 12 months and recipients must be certified for each year of service. Previous ARA service in RAEME may be aggregated towards the award.


Civilian

The recipient must be a member of the Australian Public Service who is about to retire and:

- (1) has completed at least 20 years service in RAEME units, or
- (2) has served a total of 20 combined years of service as:
 - (a) an officer or soldier in the ARA or Full-Time Duty in the ARES as a member of RAEME; and
 - (b) a member of the Australian Public Service employed in RAEME units.

Eligible Service

Eligible service can also be aggregated in a number of other ways including service with other countries EME Corps equivalent,



former members of WRAAC allotted to RAEME in 1983, personnel transferred to RAEME as a consequence of the 1973 re-organisation and personnel who served with other Australian Armed Services.

Nomination Procedure

To gain a certificate nominations should be in the format shown in Annex A of RAEME Corps Instruction Number 18 - The RAEME Recognition of Service Certificate, Issue 1, Sep 87. Nominations should reach DGEME 40 days prior to the member's date of discharge or retirement.

- * **ARA** - The member's unit should nominate to DGEME.
- * **ARes** - The Senior RAEME Rep with the member's ARES unit should verify eligibility with the ARES Records Cell, Career Management Agency 360 St Kilda Road, Melbourne VIC 3004 then forward details to DGEME.

Military and civilian members who are eligible but have not received a certificate should request issue through the last RAEME unit in which they served or directly to DGEME (for attention:
