

Hi Ray,

Just a quick email to thank you and your team for the Spanner Packs that we recently received here in Kabul. I know all the RAEME guys here appreciated the items that they received and, perhaps as importantly, the fact that there are people back in Australia who realise we still have an enduring presence here in Afghanistan fighting to ensure the security of Afghanistan, Australia and the home nations of the broader Coalition (<https://www.rs.nato.int/default.aspx>).

As you may be aware, we have a quite number of Australians providing Train, Advise, Assist (TAA) to the Afghan Army and Police in their fight against the insurgents. What you may not be aware is that a number of us are providing this function from a log (including maintenance), medical and ICT perspective. Indeed, the two most senior advisors to the ANA and ANP on logistic matters are both Australian military.

From a logistic perspective I think both the ANA and the ANP are doing pretty well as they have been able to sustain all six Corps of the ANA in the fight this year as well as all the Police Zones, the Afghan Air Force and the Special Forces. Winter has just started to bite with the first snow in Kabul and so the focus for us at the moment is getting the cold weather clothing, winter fuel and associated items out to all the units (using the ANA and ANP distribution networks) before the roads all close. At the same time we are stocking up the Corps and Zones with repair parts so they can reset their units over the winter period.

All the best to your committee and please pass on my thanks to all involved in preparing and distributing the Spanner Packs. As you would know from your own experiences, just the knowledge that there are people back in Australia who are proud of what is being achieved is a big deal for our team here on the ground.



PLAN CENTAUR UPDATE

Director General, BRIG David McGahey

Plan CENTAUR is enhancing operational capability while improving efficiencies in the barracks environment through the delivery of a series of maintenance reform and improvement projects in stages over a three year period.

CENTAUR will soon complete the first stage of its implementation phase which is already having an impact on the way maintenance is carried out in Army. Efficiencies as a result of Lean training, improvements in the accuracy of force generation demand planning and access to technical and production information on portable ICT devices in workshops are just some of the ways Plan CENTAUR is reforming maintenance practices.

Director General, BRIG David McGahey said “after a period of detailed analysis we are excited to be delivering improvements for Craftsman right through to Defence’s strategic equipment managers. As well as process changes we have also delivered improved tooling and trialled a smarter way to provide workshop consumables”.

In May, the first of two trials of improved portable ICT devices began in 3 CSSB. The trials introduced handheld tablets to enable maintainers to access tech pubs on the workshop floor. It is testing the viability of software and hardware, and measures the efficiencies in work practices as a result. A second trial has started in June in 2/14 LHR (QMI).

Meanwhile, Lean training continued in 7 CSSB in May. All three combat Brigades have now been exposed to Lean and the Units involved are reporting greater efficiency and a higher standard of maintenance. WO1 Kitching, ASM 2 Cav Regt said “the workshop was disorganised which contributed to waste. We now have a more functional layout and reduced waste which has increased the standard of maintenance. An outcome is that the transition to CSS CONOPS has been relatively smooth.”

Plan CENTAUR has identified multiple MILIS improvements. It has also identified means of reducing specialist training; improving the flow of the reverse supply chain and is developing a blueprint for adoption of information technology to enhance maintenance decisions.

In the next stage, Plan CENTAUR plans to build upon the productivity and training improvements started in stage one along with a number of new initiatives. A key focus will also be the development of a maintenance strategy for Army to inform the way future capabilities are maintained.

VIETNAM WAR MEMORIAL COMMEMORATIVE PARK

A dedication day was held on Saturday 16th December. It is a memorial for the Vietnamese and Australian Vietnam Veterans. Australian National Anthem was sung by Dual Identity Leadership Program graduates. The South Vietnamese National Anthem was sung by a Ladies Choir of the Women's Association of the Australian Vietnamese Community Victorian Chapter. There are a range of memorials, all in black marble. The central section, comprising of the left side dedicated to the 521 Australians defending the Republic of Vietnam.

The next wall is in Vietnamese script detailing all forces defending Vietnam and the unknown - soldier.

Further to the left hand side of the central memorial there are four walls. The two on the far left have all the names of the 521 Fallen. There is a divider between the walls with the three Service insignias Navy, Army, Air Force emblazoned on it. The other two walls on the left side have the individuals, families and organizations who, have helped sponsor the memorial.

On the right side of the central memorial, there again four walls. First wall is a map of South Vietnam, showing where Australian forces including advisors were spread throughout all the provinces. Second wall, is a map of Phuoc Tuy province, where our major bases in Nui Dat and Vung Tau were located. Long Tan is indicated within the province.

Third wall shows an Australian soldier carrying a baby girl. [Helping and building relationships with local people]. The fourth wall is another map of South Vietnam all of the Areas the ARVN operated throughout all four Corps.

The Vietnamese Community Hierarchy were there, along with the Brimbank Mayor and local politicians. Both Veteran Communities were well represented, speeches made, the ode read and wreaths laid. The Clergy from the two Vietnamese religions present, then carried out a blessing of the memorial. The event was completed with a Vietnamese dance, with support from their musicians. In April 2018 there will be another dedication with the day yet to be announced.

The 2018 AGM of the National Vietnam Veterans Museum is to take place at veterans Drive, Phillip Island Victoria, on Wednesday 21 February 2018 commencing at 10:00 Hrs. WHAT IS BLOOD PRESSURE?

Blood pressure is the pressure of blood in the arteries as the heart pumps blood around the body. Blood pressure is normal. We all have it and need it to stay alive. Your blood pressure is always changing. When you are resting it is usually lower. It is often high during exercise and when you become angry or excited. Blood pressure can be measured by your GP. The result will have two numbers (e.g 120/90) The first (higher) number is the pressure when the heart actually beats and is called the systolic pressure. The second (lower) number is the pressure when the heart rests between beats and is called the diastolic pressure. Your doctor may take your blood pressure several times before deciding if your blood pressure is low, normal or high.

HERE IS A GUIDE TO BLOOD PRESSURE LEVELS IN ADULTS:

Normal - less than 140/90

Borderline - between 140/90 and 160/95

High - more than 160/95

Very high - more than 180/110.


Blood pressure is normally lower in children and in women during pregnancy. Low blood pressure is generally not a problem. However, it sometimes can be a symptom of a medical problem. Your general practitioner will advise you.

The medical term for high blood pressure is hypertension. About one in seven Australian adults have it. It increases your risk of heart disease, stroke and other heart problems.

The causes of high blood pressure are often unknown. However lifestyle factors such as smoking, being overweight, your diet, alcohol and lack of exercise can increase your risk of high blood pressure.

HEALTH ISSUES

BLOOD PRESSURE



High blood pressure rarely gives you any warning signs. The only way to know what your blood pressure is, is to have it checked every two years, or more often if your GP advises you to.

WHAT CAN I DO TO CONTROL MY BLOOD PRESSURE?

- Eat less fat and salt
- Eat plenty of cereals, fruit, fish and vegetables
- Eat less red meat
- Stay a healthy weight
- Exercise for at least 30 minutes on most or every day of the week. If you like, the 30 minutes can be accumulated in shorter sessions of at least 10 minutes.
- Limit alcohol to two glasses per day or less
- If you are given tablets to control blood pressure, take them as prescribed
- Be a non-smoker
- Have your blood pressure checked every two years or as directed by your general practitioner.


