RAEME VIctoria - MEMBERSHIPSBLUE BELLS REPORT

Our next meeting will be a zoom meeting online

This year sees the fiftieth anniversary of the Battle of Nui Le, which was the last battle fought by New Zealand and Australian forces in the north of Phuoc Tuy Province, but near to Long Khan Province South Viet Nam. The enemy were aware of the ANZAC forces gradual withdrawal from Viet Nam in1971 and had escalated their PAVN forces, which our Australian Sigs. Intel. had determined. The PAVN 33 NVA Reg. made up of two Battalions over 1100 well trained soldiers, believed, inadvertently, that we had dispatched our Artillery RTA. Due to lengthy pre-embarkation preparation for RTA the 48 Medium Gun Tanks along with 4 RAEME ARVs, 3 Dozer and 3 Bridge layer Centurions were taken to Vung Tau and had left five days earlier. B and D Cos of 4 RAR/NZ [ANZAC] along with Victor [Kiwi] was Tasked with reconnaissance in force Operation named Ivanhoe started on September 20. D Company, 3 Battalion, RAR, 1 Tp A Sqn 4 Tp C Sqn 3 Cav. Reg. 2 Tp 1 Fd Sqn, 104 Fd Bat Arty, 104 Sig Sqn & amp;161 Recce Flt. On the September 19 a PAVN force had rocketed, mortared and attacked with small arms fire a Regional Force outpost at Cam My on Route Two. They then set up ambush sites, expecting the Australian relief forces to arrive. The Australian forces took an alternative route. On the morning of the 21 st D Co 11 Plt. Found sawn logs near the S E part of the Courtney Plantation, which meant bunkers nearby. In the early afternoon September 20,11 Plt made first contact with a group of 15, killing two enemy during the brief contact, without incurring casualties themselves. B and D Cos harboured in their separate defensive positions overnight. They began searching for the PAVN early on the morning of the September 21. Late afternoon B Co concentrated into a night defensive position where they could receive re- supply and Cas. Evac. At 9.00 while following a track 12 Plt. D Co came under heavy fire just 10M away. RPG rounds killed machine gunner Jimmy Dudd instantly and wounded two others, including Plt. Co 2lt.Graham Skinkston. Private Kemp crawled forward and tried repeatedly to retrieve Duff's body. He was ordered back. As 11 Plt. Approached, they encountered another enemy group, who were driven off. 11 Plt. Continued to repel repeated attacks over two hours and had to be resupplied with ammunition by helicopter. 104 Fd Bat. Arty and 30 aircraft support were called in by the Forward Observer, which pounded the bunkers with intense firepower for four hours till 15.00. pilots

reported large numbers of enemy leaving the bunker system and heading northwards. D Co Commander told his platoon commanders, that they would have to assault the bunkers. At 15.40, D Co attacked, within 10 minutes and 50 M into the system they were in the fire lanes of a skilled enemy, who were following commands and concentrated their fire on D Cos machine – gunners. Privates Brian Beilken and Rod Sprigg were immediately killed. They fell just 15M from the bunkers. Private Keith Kingston – Powles was also killed while attempting to bring his machine gun into action. Private Ralph Niblett was critically wounded in the chest and died later. Private K.G. [Fred] Casson into the fire to check the dead and retrieved M60 and ammo belts and crawled back.2Lt. Mckay also moved forward and retrieved the other M60. He then used it to deter the enemy who were trying to outflank and move back. Meanwhile enemy groups left their bunkers and followed up behind the withdrawing troops. Staying close to avoid air and arty support also taking advantage of the jungle canopy. At 1815 D Co moved back into a night circular position, allowing platoons to link up, with a total of 85 men. The NVA, continually harassed with RPG, grenade and small arms. Lt.Gregory Gilbert D Cos forward observer, unable to read his map, had to recall grid references and mentally calculate distances to walk in arty fire 100M of the perimeter. At 2100 2 Lt. Mckay was shot in the shoulder by sniper in a tree. He had to sit out the night, with his wound bleeding. This was last of the enemy activity and the arty dropped their support for the "Long" night. Wounded soldiers within the Co position who could not be medi-vaced due to the situation. September 22 morning at first light D Co sent out clearing patrols. They found one dead NVA soldier, armed with a loaded RPG2, some heavy drag marks and blood trails. The enemy had withdrawn during the night leaving few other traces. September 23 saw Victor Co [NZ] moved up to support D Co. In torrential rain, the two Cos moved back into the abandoned NVA bunker area and retrieved the bodies of the three Australian soldiers killed 2 days earlier. Victor Co cleared a track to a winch point, where Kiwi riflemen formed an impromptu "guard of honour" in tribute as the litters passed. Five Australians were killed and 30 wounded. 14 NVA bodies were recovered from the battlefield. 2 Lt. Garry McKay was awarded the Military Cross. Captain Gregory Gilbert distinguished Service Medal and Private Kevin Casson Mention in Dispatches.

This battle is similar to Operation Coburg with Charlie Co 7 Battalion Royal Australian Regiment bunker attack in Bien Hoa province February 7 1968, as illustrated in the book; "All Day Long The Noise of Battle".

We are continuing with the plaque installations within the RAEME Section of the Peace Garden at V V A A Museum Phillip Island. 1 Armoured Regiment LAD and 1 Field Squadron Workshop are finished and paid for. I will deliver them to the museum ASAP. 17 Construction Squadron Workshop is in the design phase

"Horrie the War Dog" Adopted in Egypt

Early in 1941, Private Jim Moody, VX13091, 2/1st Machine Gun Battalion found a puppy in the Ikingi Mariut area of the Western Desert, Egypt. "Horrie" became the unofficial mascot of the battalion, travelling with them from Egypt to Greece, Crete, Palestine and Syria then back to Australia in 1942.

Horrie was intelligent and easily trained. He acted as a guard dog and many times gave early warning of the approach of enemy aircraft. He survived the sinking of the Costa Rica on which the unit was being evacuated from Greece to Crete. In Crete, he was wounded by a bomb splinter, which had to be removed with a knife. To keep him warm in Syria's severe cold, Horrie was issued with a coat cut from a soldier's service dress tunic.

Smuggled into Australia

When Moody returned to Australia in April 1942, he smuggled Horrie ashore inside a modified travelling pack. The pack was lined with wood and had slits cut in the back for ventilation.

Horrie lived in Australia for almost three years before disaster struck.

Discovered by quarantine officials

Horrie's story was about to be published in a book by Ion Idriess, Horrie the wog-dog: with the A.I.F. in Egypt, Greece, Crete and Palestine. Moody offered to use the publicity Horrie would get from the book to assist the Red Cross Society's fund-raising efforts. This alerted quarantine officials to the dog's history. They were adamant: Moody had to surrender Horrie, who was destroyed on 12 March 1945.

Anthony Hill's book Animal heroes suggested a different ending for Horrie. Hill claimed that a look-alike dog was surrendered in Horrie's place, and that Horrie lived the rest of his life near Corryong, Victoria.

FROM TANKS TO TRACTORS



The Problem

Australia is facing a chronic skilled farm labour shortage, following our international border closure and the nation's hard border stance during the ongoing COVID19 pandemic.

Our Grains sector is at risk of reputational harm and market failure especially from a lack of skilled heavy farm machinery operators as well as truck and other farm workers, who are central to the proper functioning of the entire grains supply chain. Potential losses on some farms could be many \$millions, with \$billions at risk on a national level.

Australia is at or close to the technical threshold of "full employment", putting the grains industry in the difficult situation of competing for workers in a very tight labour market, particularly with a booming mining economy that also requires workers with the same or similar skill sets.

The industry, initially in WA and Queensland, requires access to a suitable workforce by early mid-September 2021 in preparation for the upcoming harvest season. The situation in most other States is similar, if slightly delayed as the grains in WA are the first due for harvesting. Please note the short lead time.

Australian broadacre agriculture urgently requires thousands of experienced heavy farm machinery operators and truck driversas well as a range of other trades.

It is vital to have these people, to ensure our grains sector remains globally competitive, and to avoid losing our markets to international competitors – this is a likely scenario if the required tonnages are unable to move into port to meet the needs of overseas markets.
