NUI Dat TAOR Patrols

As there were 700 plus riflemen available for operations both in and outside the ANZAC Total Area of Responsibility. This situation put stress on the infantry battalions. TAOR patrols spread out around the Nui Dat Base not unlike a spider web. They were essential to give the base early warning of attack. A lesson learnt from the Long Tan Battle. Some RAEME Units were tasked with TAOR patrols, from Nui Dat to support the Battalions of the Royal Australian Regiment.

Training of NCOs for 1 Field Squadron Workshop by 9th Battalion was established in early December 1968. 17 Construction Squadron Workshop combined with 5th Battalion. At a similar time 106 Field workshop commenced training NCOs with the 4th ANZAC Battalion. This arrangement continued with the replacement Battalions. The "TAOR" Patrol consisted of a seven soldier section, and although RAEME Units were tasked, other Corp members who were part of the Units were included. The Section comprised of two forward scouts, section leader [an NCO], radio operator, two on the machine gun and two rifle men. Weapons practice would be held at the range during the prescribed day. Claymore mines would be carried by the patrol. A briefing was held with the NCOs prior to the start of the Unit Patrols by the specific Battalion the Section would be patrolling for. Sometimes patrols left from Nui Dat base, late in the afternoon, on foot and other times the sections would be taken out by truck, to their start position.

An 1850 Curfew was imposed on the South Vietnamese population which they did not always respond to. The radio operator would use a three horizontal, three vertical grid position figure code, which would be converted to letters, using the phonetic alphabet. Net frequency would change at midnight. Radio contact was of major importance in case of any interlopers, other lost patrols, or the need for fire support, or dust – off.

When we had gone out 1800 metres we would harbour up in an ambush triangle, with a coms cord connecting us. Claymore mines would be set up in arcs of fire. One person at each point would be on guard concentrating on any activity around our location during the night. Always advisable not to be in the company of a heavy snorer, as a kick from a GP boot was usual method of reducing the noise. Our food would be a bar of high energy chocolate, which left unattended would be devoured by the famed "Muncher Ants". Returning in the morning we may be met by people, coming from the local villages heading out to work in the paddy fields. On return would be given the morning to get back into order. Cleaning and returning weapons, claymores, radio, compass, code book etc.

Report on Kindred Organisation & Unit Associations Forum

The Kindred Organisation & Unit Associations Forum was held on Tuesday 7th Dec 2021 at ANZAC House. As Jamie Twidale was stood down under a cloud, the acting CEO is currently Brian Cairns. The 7th Bn RAR Assn (VIC); Raymond Carr, (son of a past member) and 2/2nd Pioneer Battalion Assn all had written to ANZAC House complaining, in general, about the restricted numbers that were allowed to attend the ANZAC Day march compared to the 82,000 fans who were allowed to attend an AFL game. As well as the changing rules leading up to ANZAC Day.

The Chairperson, Mr John Cullen OAM said that the RSL had employed a full-time person to manage registrations for ANZAC Day and to work with DHHS regards rules and regulations. Apparently, the rules from DHHS kept changing, virtually daily! In addition, the Health Department and the City of Melbourne had differing opinions surrounding the rules. It was stated that VICPOL worked well with the RSL team. On the day of the March, the Govt sent down 8 inspectors on site to observe if any rules were being breached!

Next year (2022) the proposed Form Up Point (FUP) for the March is opposite the Art Centre – on the City side of Linlithgow Ave. It is also proposed that we will go back to the normal march format, with our banners as well as the Vets in cars! (As long as no further restrictions are imposed upon us). However, registration will be required together with proof of Vaccination.

Guidance on how to do all this, together with instructions will be sent out to Associations in January 2022. It was suggested that Associations are not keeping the RSL updated with changes in Contact details of key personnel in their Associations.

A memorial service for Albert Jacka is to be held at the St Kilda Cemetery on 16 Jan 2022 at 1400h. You are welcome to attend.

The next KO&UA meeting is scheduled for Monday 7 March 2022.

War History

The war memorial stands in the middle of Memorial Park, Tambar Springs, NSW.

The memorial includes an obelisk of Italian marble surmounted by a marble sculpture of a young soldier, with downcast eyes and resting easy. Inscribed on the side with the Honour Roll, and relief sculptures of crossed swords adorn the base of monument. The memorial is said to be the earliest memorial erected in country Australia to World War I Servicemen.

Devastating losses had been sustained and would continue to unfold throughout the war, but for a farmer in north-west NSW the greatest tragedy had already come to pass. A telegram had been delivered to Thomas Turner and his wife, Alice, at their property 'The Folly' in the



Tambar Springs district. It delivered the news that their son, James, had been killed in action at the Battle of the Somme and his body unable to be recovered. Thomas and Alice bought some land and commissioned the Italian marble piece, and it was erected at a cost of £400, including £100 for purchase of land, fencing and original gates and £300 for the erection of the monument, kerbing, railing and lettering. History states that 92 servicemen and the highest number of servicemen per capita from the small rural village of Tambar Springs and district answered the patriotic call.

For those that love the history of our countries service and sacrifices, there is an opportunity to purchase an oil painting that has beautifully captured this memorial. (as per below image).

The artist, Darlene Lavett is a school friend of mine (the editor) and has also served within the Army in Australia and overseas.

I myself have purchased one of the limited prints, where it will be displayed with pride at our working pub & training centre.
