### Spanners on the Front Line!

Over July and into August 2022 a couple of our local Spanners were very privileged to be invited to attend some very moving rededication services conducted for our missing soldiers in France. A rededication service occurs when the identity of an "unknown soldier" is discovered. Over this period, the Un-Recovered War Casualty (UWC-A) section of the Australian Army, working in conjunction with the Army's Jonathan Church Good Soldering Award recipients 2020-22 worked a very busy program to commemorate 16 recently identified Australian Soldiers.

For each individual soldier the previous "Unknown" headstone is removed and replaced with a new headstone identifying the soldier. Families are contacted and invited to attend the service as well as providing with some appropriate words from that soldier's family. During the service eulogies were read, bugles played, prayers were said, and national anthems were also sung. Each service was very moving and attended by Commonwealth, Australian and local officials. Each service also reminded us that behind these headstones was a loved one lost so long ago. Yes, even after over 100 years our government is dedicated to identifying our missing soldiers.

### **Enter Fallen Diggers**

Of these 16 soldiers dedicated, 15 are the direct result of Fallen Diggers' efforts. Fallen Diggers are a local not for profit group of volunteers who do an amazing job at researching and identifying our missing soldiers. Since 2013 they have successfully identified over 50 missing soldiers. Many more submissions are waiting for approval. Their research has uncovered many more field burials that are waiting for exploration and possible excavation from both WW1 and WW11. They work very closely with UWC-A however, they remain a civilian volunteer group. The work that this group does is amazing, successful, and very interesting.

### A special Presentation at Le Hamel



Some of our local "Spanners" (and Fallen Diggers researchers) Andrew Moon, supported by Tony Moon, Michael Newbond and Peter Zimmerman were privileged to be invited to present Cpl Stan Cochrane's story to the UWC-A and the Jonathan Church award winners. Andrew asked to put some context arounds Stan's life, his experiences, his participation at the battle of Le Hamel and ultimately his fate. Andrew also presented his research and findings that led to Stan's identification at Crucifix Corner Cemetery in France. The presentation was delivered on the actual battlefield site close to the French village of Le Hamel. Those of you with a knowledge of WW1 history will understand that the battle of Le Hamel fought in the early hours of 4 July 1918 and was one of General Monash's early masterpieces. Fallen Diggers felt very honoured

to be asked to present in this environment and to put some context around one of our soldiers. What an opportunity!

**Andrew said,** "We started the presentation by standing on the exact spot where the 13<sup>th</sup> Bn jump off tapes were laid at 03:00 on the morning of 4 July 1918. We presented a ground orientation brief and familiarised the audience with a lay of the land. We then gave a brief of the units involved and their respective tasks. The brief then focussed on Stan Cochrane and his involvement in the battle. We talked about his role, being part of the support company, where he was dropping off stores and equipment for the 13<sup>th</sup> Bn. We talked in depth about the circumstances surrounding his death, how and where it happened. We pointed to these locations "on the ground" and identified

them on the original 1918 battle maps. We also discussed why it was three days before he was buried and why, we think, he was buried without his identity. We then went through to the discovery process, the research methods used, the first principal documents and the approval process that led to the eventual rededication ceremony the following day. On a personal note, Stan Cochrane was a local soldier. He was born and grew up in Poowong. His family remain in the Korumburra area to this day. We know the Cochrane family well. We went to school with them, and my brother Tony lives only a kilometre from Stan's nephew Colin. I hope the audience gained an insight into the entire process and understood that behind each rededication service, there is story of a lost soldier that they are helping to remember."

Cpl Stan Cochrane's service was attended by Fallen Diggers researcher Andrew Moon. Andrew and Stan came from the same district and Andrew attended school with members of the Cochrane family. Andrew was pivotal in Stan's eventual discovery. Stans service was one of 16 conducted over July/August 2022. Stan's service was attended by representatives from the Commonwealth War Graves, the Australian Embassy, the Mayor of Villers Bretonneux as well as UWCV\_A , Fallen Diggers and the Jonathan Church winners form the ADF. n

### Lay in State

A very special event occurred on 14 July when the remains of a recently discovered digger were held "In State" at Menin Gate in Ypres. This soldier was uncovered whilst excavations were being undertaken in the Polygon Wood sector. Our soldier was held In State for 24 hours and then given a full Military funeral at Tyne Cot Cemetery the next day. This was a very emotional but fitting tribute for one of our own. Hopefully, one day, we will be able to place a name on his headstone.

UWC-A latest discovery was laid in state at Menin Gate. This soldier was found in Polygon wood.





Our latest Unknown Soldier was finally laid to rest, at Tyne Cot. Hopefully, one day, he will have his identity discovered.

If you want to find out more about Fallen Diggers and some of the amazing work or incredible projects they are undertaking they are going to do a "Have a beer with Fallen Diggers Day". It will be \$30 per head. It will be held at the Montmorency RSL, commencing from 1300hrs on Sunday 23 October. There will be finger food supplied and you buy your own drinks. They do a presentation of recent dedication ceremonies in France, and what future Archaeological surveys they wish to do. This event is open to all, so come and say G'day, listen to the presentation. Swap some stories and you never know; you may wish to get involved. You wont regret it.
