Dedication of the RAEME Monument at Bulimba, Queensland, 28 November 2009

The Royal Australian Electrical and Mechanical Engineers' Association (Qld) has erected a monument to the units and their craftsmen who served in the Bulimba Barracks since 1945, the year that the Australian Army was handed the keys to the site by the United States Army.

The unit names are immortalised on a bronze plaque attached to the sandstone monument. 36 units in all, both Regular Army and Army Reserve / Citizens Military Forces. Obituary - Major Mick Lappin

Mr. Len Avery via Graham Smith – RAR Association

Mick was born on 17 November 1947 at Stamford Lincolnshire, England, the second youngest of eight brothers and sisters.

After arriving in Australia Mick initially lived at Newborough and then moved to Morwell where he lived with his oldest brother Terry and wife Monica whilst he attended St Paul's College in Traralgon in the Latrobe Valley in Gippsland.

It was at St Paul's College where he met up with Frank Edwards and John Opdam who would both serve in the Army and Vietnam with Mick, although in different trades. Mick joined the Army around 1966 after which he was posted to the RAEME Training Centre at Bandiana to do his Radio Mech's Course. Those on his course included Bob Digance, Quincy Townsend, Brian Reardon, Bob van Aken and Jim Hayne.

After completing the course Mick was posted to 2 Base Wksp at Moorebank before being "seconded" into RAEME Aviation. He packed his bags and headed to the RAAF Base at Amberley in 1967 and the 1st Aviation Regiment Workshop to be trained as an Aircraft Radio Mech. Mick was looking at a posting to Vietnam in 1968, however, a wife, Rose, and a baby daughter delayed his departure until the following year. He was posted to Vietnam as a Corporal Radio Mech with 161 (Indep) Recce Flt from 24 March 1969 until 04 March 1970.

Jim Hayne was the Sergeant in charge of the Radio Section along with Mick and Bob Digance as the Corporals. Barry Ellis was the L/CPL while Bill Reddin and George Xanthopoulos were the 'workers'. There were a few other Radio Mech's who Mick served with in Vietnam including Kevin Alsop, John Machell and John Moore.

After completing his time in Vietnam Mick was posted back to the 1st Aviation Regiment Workshop at Amberley until early 1972 when along with his wife and two children he was posted to 182 Recce Flt in Singapore from 19 April 1972 until 03 October 1973 as the Sergeant Radio Mech.

From 182 Recce Flt, Mick and his family, which now included three children, were posted to 161 Recce Sqn at Holsworthy. Late 1974, Mick and the family were on the move again, this time to Oakey in Queensland and the new home of Army Aviation. Mick was posted to 5 Base Workshop Battalion and subsequently ended up in the RAEME Aircraft Training Company as an instructor. Unfortunately in early 1975, Mick was diagnosed with testicular cancer and subsequently received radical radiation treatment after an operation in June 1975.

Mick was subsequently posted to 3 Base Workshop at Broadmeadows so that he could be close to his family as at that time he was only given a 50% chance of living another two years. As we all know, Mick was not going to go down without a fight and he certainly didn't like the idea of not seeing his family grow up so he fought back and proved the

doctors wrong, clearly showing the strength and character of the man.

He was subsequently posted to HQ Log Command and then in early 1978, Mick and his family, which now included four children, were posted to England and the REME Training School at Arborfield Garrison as an instructor.

In late 1979, Mick was posted to the RAEME Training Centre at Bandiana as an instructor until early 1981 when he was posted to Adelaide with the Base Repair Facility and 16 Air Defence Regiment at Woodside in support of the Rapier Team. Mick and his family spent 10 years in Adelaide during which time he did some 'cross training' with his part time studies for his Theology Degree.

Mick was commissioned as a Captain and was subsequently promoted to Major. From Adelaide he was posted to Perth and from there to Queensland where Mick was given the opportunity to study full time to finish his degree in Theology. Mick was ordained as a Chaplain in 1995. His first posting was to the Royal Military College in Canberra where he went unaccompanied as Rose was working in Brisbane. He was subsequently posted back to Brisbane as the Chaplain with the Sixth Battalion RAR during which time he was posted to East Timor. Mick was awarded the Conspicuous Service Medal (CSM) on 08 June 1998 for his outstanding service. Unfortunately Mick's health began to deteriorate and he was medically discharged from the Army after he returned from East Timor.

He worked as a Chaplain with the Queensland Police Force for about two years before his health and mobility deteriorated further and he had to finally give up the work that he enjoyed so much however, Mick never stopped caring for people and offering support to those who were not enjoying good health, myself included.

Mick and Rose subsequently moved to Melbourne to be closer to their family and Rose's new job. The last few years have been very tough for Mick and Rose as Mick's health and mobility continued to deteriorate. He went through a number of operations on his back and suffered periods of terrible pain. It was Mick and Rose's plan to move to Adelaide where they had built a new home near Normanville. They were in the process of going home when Mick became very sick about three months ago. He was subsequently admitted to the Epworth Hospital in Melbourne with serious problems with his stomach and bowel. Mick went through a number of major operations which unfortunately did not improve the situation and recovery from the operations became an impossible task. Sadly this is one battle that he was unable to win.

Mick is survived by his wonderful wife Rose, his daughter Sonya and sons Sean, Simon and Michael Paul plus their extended family including ten wonderful and loving grandchildren, not forgetting the rest of the Lappin Clan. Mick is now at peace and he will not suffer any more pain.

Arrangements are being made to take Mick to Adelaide where the funeral will be held at a date to be advised.

Head of Corps Message Brigadier David Creagh



Life continues at pace for all of you and to be frank I think the tempo we are all enjoying these days is the status quo.

I continue to enjoy success in getting out and about in my capacity as your Head of Corps My most recent visit was to Campbell Barracks,

home of the Special Air Service Regiment.

None of us would disagree from any coalface view that processes for both acquisition and modification of equipment need to be agile and operationally focussed. To that end Army Headquarters is working hard to streamline staff processes for Operationally Urgent Requirements, acceptance into service, and management of equipment groundings and restrictions. The challenge in this is ensuring that we strike the right balance between acceptance of technical risk and operational risk. DTR –A is contributing to this debate and I have asked him to develop a discussion paper on this for presentation to the Corps conference and I would encourage you to contribute to this important discussion.

In May of this year the Chief of Staff at Army Headquarters wrote to all Heads of Corps seeking input in the form of a Corps position on the wearing of regimental berets and accoutrements. After wide consultation I presented the Corps position (in principle support for the complete removal of the beret as an authorised form of headdress but as an interim measure and until such time as this decision is taken

that RAEME personnel posted to units who possess a regimental beret (for example RAAC, AAVN) may wear that beret with their Corps Cap badge). Unit affiliation will still be recognised through the wearing of the unit colour patch on the puggaree and where applicable, the unit Velcro patch on DPCU. I know that for many of you that this is a highly emotive issue so once CA has made his decision I will ensure that you are notified.

As I indicated in the Corps newsletter earlier this year I was delighted with the very positive feedback we received on the conduct of the 2009 Corps Conference. In response to this feedback this year's program has been adjusted to incorporate your input. The theme for this year's conference is Maintaining the Army of 2019. I can now confirm that Head Land Systems, MAJGEN Cavengah will deliver the keynote address and we have a number of senior personnel who will present over the two days including Brigadier Greg Bilton from Army Headquarters, Mr David McGahey from Joint Logistics Command and the Deputy Commander of 16 Aviation.

Updates will be provided on a number of the Adaptive Army sessions we covered in 2009 and both DOCM and SCMA will provide career management presentations. We will also receive some recent operations updates from the 'young Turks' and the HOC team have worked hard to try and strike the right balance between a busy and informative program but one that gives you all the opportunity to contribute. I am confident that the conference will be both informative and enjoyable and well worth the investment of the airfare too and from Albury.


