CRAFTSMEN AT 3RD CAVALRY REGIMENT MEMORIAL DEDICATION

On Beersheba Day – 31 October 2011 the National War Memorial to Cavalry (Vietnam) was opened and consecrated under sunny skies at Tongala, Victoria. Over 130 “black hat” veterans turned up from all over Australia including about 15 “black hat” bluebells.

We were very proud that our COL COMDT. Colonel Brian Jones attended. His effort in returning from another function in Canberra to be with us was appreciated. He remarked on the relaxed rapport between the Bluebells and other “black hats”.



The Memorial was opened by MAJ. GEN. David McLachlan AO and it was consecrated by one of our Squadron veterans, Father Alan Buckingham. Local town dignitaries and politicians were present. Tongala school children carried the flags representing our KIA (20) while other children waved flags from the footpaths as the parade, led by two Lighthorsemen, passed by.

The Memorial is an arc of tall black reflective granite stones engraved in silver with the names of all who

served in the Squadron in Vietnam with our KIA in engraved in gold on the centre column.

One in eight of the Squadron were casualties: 20 KIA and 115 WIA. Among the LAD Craftsman Doug Borlace was KIA and 6 Craftsmen were WIA.

Decorations were awarded to 28 in the Squadron including an MBE, 3 Military Crosses, 1 Distinguished Conduct Medal, 2 Military Medals, 2 Medals of Gallantry, 3 Commendations for Distinguished Service and 16 Mentions in Dispatches. A further 9 American and Vietnamese awards were made.

We would welcome an expression of interest from any sapper particularly those from the 7 Fd Sqn Group who would like to join us for this reunion and perhaps include an add-on after the Kuamut event to visit the Keningua / Sook area for 4-5 days. Partners are encouraged to join us.

Meanwhile input to the book is first priority and secondly finding “The Kuamut Krew” is next on the to-do list.

The Green Thing

In the queue at the supermarket, the check-out girl told an older man that he should bring his own grocery bags because plastic bags weren't good for the environment.

The man apologised to her and explained, "We didn't have the green thing back in my day."

The girl responded, "That's our problem today. Your generation didn't care enough to save our environment."

She was right -- our generation didn't have the green thing in its day.

Back then, we returned milk bottles, soft-drink bottles and beer bottles to the store. The store sent them back to the factory to be washed and sterilised and refilled, so it could use the same bottles over and over. So they really were recycled. But we didn't have the green thing back in our day.

We walked up stairs, because we didn't have an escalator in every store and office building. We walked to the grocery store and didn't climb into a 300-horsepower motor vehicle every time we had to go two blocks. But she was right. We didn't have the green thing in our day.

Back then, we washed the baby's nappies because we didn't have the throw-away kind. We dried clothes on a line, not in an energy-gobbling machine burning up 3000 watts -- wind and solar power really did dry the clothes. Kids got hand-me-down clothes from their brothers or sisters, not always brand-new clothing. But that older man is right; we didn't have the green thing back in our day.

Back then, we had a radio and maybe one TV in the house -- not a TV in every room. And the TV had a small screen the size of a handkerchief (remember them?), not a screen the size of the front door! In the kitchen, we blended and stirred by hand because we didn't have electric machines to do everything for us. When we packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, we reused a wadded up old newspaper to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble-wrap. Back then, we didn't fire up an engine and burn gasoline just to cut the lawn. We used a push mower that ran on human power. We exercised by working so we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity. But she's right; we didn't have the green thing back then.

We drank from the tap or a bubbler fountain when we were thirsty instead of using a cup or a plastic bottle every time we had a drink of water. We refilled writing pens with ink instead of buying a new pen. But we didn't have the green thing back then.

Back then, people took the tram or a bus and kids rode their bikes to school or walked instead of turning their mums into a 24-hour taxi service. And we didn't need a computerised gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites 2,000 miles out in space in order to find the nearest pizza joint.

CRAFTSMAN of the YEAR

CFN Stonehouse, an Active Reservist Vehicle Mechanic, is posted to 105 Wksp Coy, 4 CSSB, within 4 Brigade. He is currently working out of the Geelong Multi-User Depot and is a valuable team member of the 105 Wksp Forward Repair Team. CFN Stonehouse is a young, fit, confident soldier/tradesman who has displayed an excellent work ethic and initiative; he gets on with the job.



CFN Stonehouse is a regular parader. He rarely misses a parade activity and can be counted upon to volunteer for non-scheduled FRTs, within Victoria or nationally, for both military and civilian commitments.

He has demonstrated over the past 12 months the attributes that easily satisfy the criteria worthy of being considered for the 2011 Craftsman of the Year.

The following are provided as examples of the excellent year he has had. During this reporting period, he volunteered to complete two weeks in Darwin, attached to NORFORCE. His efforts resulted in him receiving an outstanding PAR. I was in attendance during this FRT and experienced first hand his ability to work alongside his regular Army counterparts and combine his civilian trade expertise with the required military skills.

There have been a number of FRTs over the last 12 months that CFN Stonehouse has volunteered for. These have included providing support to 4/19 PWLH in the Mount Hotham area and 8/7 RVR in Ballarat.

Additionally, CFN Stonehouse volunteered to provide support at the Queenscliffe Fort over a period of time to assist them preparing for the fort's 150th Birthday celebrations. CFN Stonehouse received nothing but praise and appreciation for these efforts by supported units.

Early this year Victoria experienced the worst floods in recent memory. 105 Wksp Coy were called upon to provide FRT

capability to Units assisting local communities to the north of Victoria. Once again, CFN Stonehouse had no hesitation in volunteering for 66% of the FRT provided.

Where possible, CFN Stonehouse has contributed to the support of weekend activities within 4 CSSB. He is considered amongst his peers as a hard working, professional tradesman, whether it is within the Geelong FRT or at company level. Hand Over Heart -The Reason

At the Salute by Veterans at the Cenotaph or any Remembrance Service it will be noticed Veterans will place their right hand over their 'Left Side' many may believe that they are placing their 'Hand over their Heart' in Respect or Remembrance of their Fallen Comrades; this is not so.

The Veterans Salute to their Fallen Comrades originated in London on Armistice Day in 1920, during the ceremony to unveil and dedicate the Cenotaph in Whitehall at the same time a funeral procession accompanying the remains of the 'Unknown Soldier' halted at the Cenotaph during the ceremony before proceeding to Westminster Abbey for internment.

The Regimental Sergeant Major of the Guards Regiment conducting the ceremony, faced with a gathering of highly decorated and high ranking military men (including many Victoria Cross winners), all wearing rows of medals, decreed that all would salute the Cenotaph as they marched past by placing their hand over their medals, signifying that *'No matter what honours we may have been awarded they are nothing compared with the honour due to those who paid the supreme sacrifice'*.

Fresh rations are no problem for Army Reserve troops now training in Victoria's Sunset Country.

They call for Jim McFarlane.

Or, more correctly, Lt. J. McFarlane, who heads the vehicle repair and maintenance section of the 4-19th Prince of Wales's Light Horse Regiment.

The unit, equipped with armored troop carriers and anti-tank weapons, is now staging a two-week training run in the Sunset Country, south-west of Mildura. The sandhills and scrubland are riddled with rabbit burrows — which is where Jim McFarlane comes in handy.

SNARES

Armed with steel traps, he makes twice-daily forays to the camp's perimeter to snare the "underground chooks."

His average daily tally: Ten rabbits for the regimental cookhouse.

The traps are on loan from the grazer who leases the 187,000-acre Crown Land property on which the unit is training, Mr Harold McArthur.

"He was delighted to have us reduce the rabbit population — but even at 10 a day, we're hardly making a dent in it," Lt. McFarlane said today.

"The lads are appreciating the extra rations . . . and it's all free."
