

Message from Representative Colonel Commandant

Once again it is my great pleasure and privilege to be writing to you through our Craftsman magazine, this time as the Representative Colonel Commandant for the Corps. My first duty must be to thank my predecessor, Brigadier Bob Millar, for perhaps his last major contribution to the Corps as its Representative Colonel Commandant. He was the DGEME in the late 1980s, Commander of 5MD in the early 1990s and Colonel Commandant 1 MD and Representative Colonel Commandant for the Corps until the end of last year. Few soldiers have contributed as much to their Corps as Brigadier Millar. On your behalf and on behalf of his Corps, I thank him.

My association with the Corps stretches back more than forty years now. To say that I have seen some changes over that period of time would be a gross understatement. However, some things have not changed – and one of these, perhaps the most important, is why the Corps was formed and why it exists in its present form.

From the time of its inception in the midst of great threat and uncertainty during World War II to today, and through changing technologies and equipment, the role of the Corps has remained constant. This was perhaps best expressed soon after World War II ended by one of the great commanders of that conflict, Field Marshal the Viscount Montgomery, when

he said "... (the Corps) exists in fact to keep the punch in the Army's fist. The hitting power of an Army lies in it being maintained at full strength in men, weapons and equipment. The only way its needs of weapons and equipment can be met is by recovering, repairing and returning to units within a matter of hours every possible gun, tank and vehicle." His statement of the role of the Corps is as valid today as it was fifty-plus years ago.

It behoves us all to ensure that we remain committed to that role and that equipment is returning to user units in the most reliable condition that time and circumstances allow.

I wish you happy soldiering and hope you are enjoying your service as much as I enjoyed mine.

From the Agenda for the forthcoming AGM, you will see we are proposing to raise all




Leonie CARTLEDGE – the wife of our President on 26th May, had an operation to her right thumb which requires having to be strapped for several months to come.





Member's
Profile



Jack Leonard WESTERNHAGEN

Jack was born in Newcastle, N.S.W. on 26th May 1933. He was educated at various Sydney Public Primary & Secondary Schools. On 26th July 1949, he enlisted in the ARA, as a 3rd Intake Apprentice Vehicle Mechanic at the Army Apprentices School Balcombe, Victoria. Upon graduation in July 1952, he was posted to S Comd Wksp RAEME, Broadmeadows (later redesignated 3 Base Wksp), then saw service at Bandiana Area Wksp (redesignated Bandiana No. 4 Shop) and Puckapunyal Area Wksp. In 1955, being successful at the Potential Instructors Course Central Instructor's School, Kapooka N.S.W. he was posted as a Regt Duty NCO/RAEME Corps instructor with 'Delta' Composite Coy (RAAOC/RAEME), 20th NS Trg Bn Puckapunyal. In November 1956, he was transferred to Ingleburn Area Wksp until the expiration of his 9 year ARA engagement on 26th July 1958.

On discharge, having married his wife Mary (a Victorian girl), they returned to Melbourne to set up house and raise a family of 5 girls and 1 boy. Jack originally enlisted in 106 Inf Wksp (under then Maj (later Lt Colonel Don MacLeod) at Chapel Street, East St. Kilda on 15th August 1958 (here he renewed friendship with many of the National Servicemen he had trained at Puckapunyal). He saw further CMF service with 8/13th VMR (APC) Regt Wksp, 105 Inf Wksp and 3 Base Wksp (CMF Component)

1964 as an Admin Officer. Reposted once again to 105 Inf Wksp until May 1965, when he was seconded to ARA/CMF (Full Time Duty) serving until May 1966 as Admin Officer RAEME Depot Staff Chapel Street before being posted as QM 1 Medium Wksp Broadmeadows. His next posting was as Training/Admin Officer 3 Base Wksp Broadmeadows until Sept 1968. He was then posted as Admin Officer AHQ (Melb) Albert Park Barracks until cessation of CMF (FTD) in May 1974 and was once again reposted as Adj/QM 105 Inf Wksp Chapel Street. He transferred to the Reserve of Officers in Sept 1974 after a service of 24 years in the Corps of RAEME.

On 24th April 1991, Jack joined the RAEME Association (Vic) Inc. and volunteered as a Committee Member. He was elected Secretary, Historian and Editor of the Association's Newsletter, positions in which he has served continually since 1991 - 2000. Jack is a well known personality within the RAEME Corps and for his liaison with AEME, RAEME Vietnam, RAAOC, RAASC/RACT, RAE Associations in Victoria and AEME/RAEME, RAEME and REME Associations interstate.

For the past 5 years, Jack has been researching into the History of RAEME CMF in Victoria 1948 - 1970.

THE CORPS MARCHES

There is no record of official approval for an AEME march during the years of World War II, but it seems that the RAEME march was used. At first this was "WHISTLE WHILE YOU WORK" from the Walt Disney film Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs. Of this, Brigadier J.C. Dean OBE. Retd. has written that for those who served in the Western Desert it brought memories of the seven big Scammel Recovery Vehicles (named after the seven dwarfs) that trundled along the road from Bardia to Cairo rescuing wrecked tanks. Later REME changed their march to an arrangement of Lilliburleo and a French tune, Aupres de ma Blond. AAO 91, August 31st, 1953, gave approval for RAEME to do likewise.

At a DEME conference in 1959 the march was discussed and a conclusion reached that the traditional link with REME should be maintained, RAEME ought to have a march of its own. This started a search for an alternative to Aupres de ma Blonde. Many suggestions were made but there was no success until Lt Colonel A.R. Newman (Director of Music, AHQ) overheard a remark at the Army Apprentices School Officer's Mess Balcombe that RAEME were the Army's backroom boys. This reminded him that there was a modern song called 'See What the Boys in the Back Room Will Have' so he made an arrangement of it. It was tried with Southern Command Band, presented to the 1961 DEME Conference, and recommended to Army HQ for approval. Copyright clearance for the use of these tunes was obtained and it was then approved on August 31st, 1967 (AAO No. 61).

The RAEME Slow March, which was approved by Army Office in 1992, is the subject of Corps Instruction No. 29, Issue 1, March 1992. The march is a special arrangement of 'The Harmonious Blacksmith', a melody written in 1720 by the renowned German composer George Frederick Handel (1685-1759). Musically the composition is particularly appropriate for a Corps of soldier craftsmen because it embodies the tempo and atmosphere of the busy workplace.

Corps Instruction No. 29 states that:

The RAEME Slow March is to be played on RAEME Parades, particularly during the March Past in Slow Time and with the approval of the Parade Commander, on other occasions where a formed body of RAEME troops are parading as part of a composite parade.






